I saw an August 1980 Quilt World magazine. Quite interesting! It cost 85 cents (\$5/year to subscribe) and was published by the House of White Birches in NH. There were very few manufacturer ads; just Mountain Mist batting, and other mags like Doll World, Crochet World, Knitting World, etc. People sent in pix of their quilts (mostly simple and puckered), and their complete addresses were included...privacy laws didn't exist then! Quilt pieces were cut with hand-drawn templates and scissors in those days; so crude by today's rotary cutting revolution! In a classified ad, someone was looking for the Oct 1976 Quilters World issue, so the issue I saw wasn't even close to the first quilt mag! [part 2 next month] ~Sheila
