

From the President

It's a new year! And you have a new president! This is my second round of serving as president. I was president in 2000 as we entered the new millennium. One of the things I like about our guild is that I think we are a welcoming group and we encourage those just starting their quilting journey.

I'd like to tell you a little about my quilting journey.

In 1975 I was in college and got a job at THE PIECE GOODS SHOP in Lima. I bought my first (used) sewing machine. I got it at a garage sale. I came across a book about quilting put out by the Simplicity pattern company and I got hooked on quilting. 1975. That means next year I will celebrate 50 years of being a quilter! I moved to Bowling Green in 1987 and I joined the guild in 1995. I have served at least once on every committee or position except secretary and historian.

In the 70's there was a quilter on PBS television named Georgia Bonesteel. I bought her book, which was a sampler book of 12 squares and was printed with a typewriter and "published" at home. She promoted hand quilting (the only kind there was then) and you quilted each block after it was pieced.

Over the years I took classes, read books and gradually learned new skills. It was so exciting when rotary cutters came out. I think I got my first one in 1978. No more cutting templates out of cardboard with scissors. I learned the importance of ¼ inch seam, and have made hundreds of quilts through the years. Among the machines I now own is a Gammill long arm.

I will try to lead the guild into an exciting future and continue to share my knowledge of quilting. I want to encourage all of you to get involved in YOUR guild. Most committee positions are not as daunting as they seem. Remember, if nobody volunteers, the president will ASSIGN the position. If you have never served on a committee, or it has been a while since you have, I challenge you to volunteer to work on just one this year.

- Your quilt can be any size and needs to have 3 layers, be quilted, and finished by April meeting

- 3) Most creative use of musical note
- 4) Most visual impact eye catching
