Special Speaker

Brian McCoy, the Redneck Quilter from Bolts and Quarters Quilt shop in Parkersburg WV is our special speaker scheduled for September 15-16. He will be doing a trunk show during our September monthly meeting that will be held on Friday night at our regular meeting location, the Simpson building. He will be bringing items to display along with items that can be purchased.

On Saturday we will be hosting a sew along featuring the "Storm at Sea" quilt using the Deb Tucker Rulers. (V Block, Diamond Rects, Large Square Squared) The quilt has 16 fabrics in total and fabric requirements will be handed out at signups. This class will be limited to the first 30 people to sign up, and sign-ups will be held at the next meeting. The rulers will be available to be bought, PREORDER ONLY, through Brian at a discounted price (V Block 23.99, Large Square Squared 49.59, Diamond Rects 27.59) Ordering information will be handed out at the time you sign up.

Saturday sew will start at 9am at the Holiday Inn in Bowling Green. You will have the option to bring a packed lunch or preorder a boxed lunch. This information will be provided at a later time. We plan to sew till around 6pm depending on how the day goes.

Thinking About Yesterday

More tidbits from 1960s crafting newsletters: There were directions for flower pressing, a felt donkey pin cushion, and making sachets from felt/bottle caps. (Apparently felt was the hot item back then!) The US 4 cent stamp was purple with Abe Lincoln's profile. Ads: Will trade quilt tops for stamps. Want a World's Fair postcard mailed to you from the fair? Send two stamps. Patterns for Denny and Dolly Dingle dolls. Zigzag machine quilt patterns: 40 cents. My original quilt patterns 15 cents each or 19 for \$2.50. Quilt patterns: Cupid's Block from Ladies Art, 1928. Snail's Trail (looks nothing like the one we know!), Sparkling Diamonds, Democratic Rose, Sandcastle and Trumpet Vine. ~Sheila

And~A Jewish Version!

One of the local synagogues wants to display a wall hanging sewn from their old Torah covers (mantles), and they asked me to help. [A Torah is the Hebrew Bible handwritten onto a parchment scroll] There are dozens of gorgeous old velvet mantles and textiles, dirty and stained from the varnished wood cabinets where they were stored. After months of planning, inspecting and coordinating schedules, three of us finally met to start cutting. It was sure scary to make that first cut! With rotary cutters, scissors, and finally, simple ripping, we rough cut the 'pretty parts', saving unsoiled velvet sections for fillers/spacers. We even saved ribbons, tassels, beading and brocades for edgings. Then the temple administrator came in to inform us they were planning on replacing seven of the current mantles in the ark (the ornate cabinet housing Torah scrolls for worship). They were currently urging congregants to honor special events or loved ones by sponsoring a purchase. Between that and of course, supply chain problems, it would be months, maybe even a year, before those mantles were replaced, and they want THOSE in the guilt as well. Our production ground to a halt, the cut pieces lovingly wrapped in a sheet to safely store for later, and I'm off duty for now! ~Sheila
