

From the President

When is your quilt finished? I often catch myself saying "It's done!" when the last border is attached to the top. Well of course the quilt isn't done. Only the top.

There are many more steps. There is making or cutting the backing and batting, then having it quilted. Then of course the binding. (a step I often delay) And don't forget the label!

Is it done now? I say no. I try to inspect the quilt carefully on both the top and the bottom. I look for threads that are sticking to the surface and for seams that may have started to open up. Are there blocks out of place? (of course, it is too late to change that now). Is the binding satisfactory? Is there any dirt or stains to be removed?

I don't hear most quilters talking about this final step in quilt, making. I think it is important and I try to do it with each quilt. Of course, if I am meeting a deadline, this step might get skipped.

And don't forget to take a photo of your masterpiece! This is so important. Now it is DONE!

National Quilting Day was first celebrated in 1991 after members of the National Quilting Association who were attending the 22nd Annual Show in Lincoln, Nebraska, voted in favor of a motion to begin celebrating the holiday. Although the NQA initially designated the third Saturday in March as National Quilting Day, the celebration has unofficially grown to encompass the entire month of March in recent years.

On National Quilting Day, quilts are hung outside the homes to educate and inspire people to join in celebrating this ancient creative skill and as a sign that you recognize this event and that you are observing it.




